SECOND READING

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians.

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end.

For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus began to speak in the synagogue at Nazareth: "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, "Is not this Joseph's son?" He said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor, cure yourself!' And you will say, 'Do here also in your hometown the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum."

And he said, "Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in the prophet's hometown. But the truth is, there were many widows in Israel in the time of Elijah, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, and there was a severe famine over all the land; yet Elijah was sent to none of them except to a widow at Zarephath in Sidon. Invite, Welcome, Connect Digital Gathering February 9

Invite, Welcome, Connect provides tools and strategies for congregations who wish to deepen their relationships with their current members and their communities. You will be hearing more about these tools during the annual meeting and in the coming weeks. In addition, *Invite, Welcome, Connect* is holding a digital gathering to discuss two timely topics on February 9 from 12 – 1:30pm PST. Several St. Martin's parishioners will be attending. The focus questions will be: "How do we Welcome and Connect those who are on our congregation's Digital Front Porch, those whose initial contacts are online and invisible? How do we Re-Connect with parishioners who are no longer as active as they were in their pre-pandemic faith communities?"

The panelists, made up of both clergy and lay leaders, will discuss creative solutions and ways to address these questions in your congregation. Our Next Sacred Ground Circle is Forming

Sacred Ground is a discussion series on race, grounded in faith, developed by the Episcopal Church. Small groups use films and readings to walk through chapters of America's history of race and racism, while weaving in threads of family story, economic class, and political and regional identity.

Pastor Casey and Carole Hom will be facilitating a ten-session Sacred Ground circle on Monday evenings, beginning in late February, and meeting every three weeks. Due to the challenging nature of the material, the circle will be limited to 10 people, ages 16+, who can commit to all ten sessions.
