#### Schedule for Ash Wednesday, March 2

Lent is a wonderful time to reconnect with worship and spiritual practices, and it begins with the observance of Ash Wednesday on March 2. Please join us for any or all of the following Ash Wednesday offerings:

- 7am: A brief, indoor service with the imposition of ashes. This will not be livestreamed.
- 12pm: A brief, indoor service with the imposition of ashes, followed by a self-paced Prayer Walk around our church campus. Those who wish may start directly with the Prayer Walk.
- 7pm: A Holy Eucharist with the imposition of ashes. This will be a hybrid service, held in person inside the church and also livestreamed via Zoom and Facebook.

**More about the Prayer Walk:** This self-paced, guided tour of five prayer stations around our church grounds was created last year when gathering indoors was impossible, even for worship. We are bringing it back this year because of the overwhelmingly positive response to it. The tour begins at the welcome station under the main awning in front of the sanctuary. Each station will include a reflection, activity, and optional listen-along podcast (bring your "device" and headphones if you want to listen to the recordings). **Station 3 will include take-home packets of** 

**ashes** – participants may go straight to this station for pickup even if they are unable to spend time at the other stations. Masks and social distancing will be required.

The Prayer Walk will also be available on Sunday, March 6, from 11:30 to 1 pm for anyone who was unable to join us on Wednesday or would like another opportunity for this practice.

# Prayers for Ukraine

As we continue to follow the news of war in Eastern Europe, please remember to find trusted and reliable journalistic sources, and take care when sharing information online that contains graphic images or videos. <u>Presiding Bishop Michael Curry</u> and our diocesan <u>Bishop Megan Traquair</u> have shared messages of solidarity and hope. We offer this prayer:

Almighty God, Prince of Peace, we pray for our siblings in Ukraine who are under siege. We ask for your comfort and protection over them as they cower underground, weighing impossible decisions in the darkness. For those who choose to gather their belongings and their children and flee their homeland, we ask that they find refuge in the open arms of their neighbors around the world. For those who remain, to stand and defend, we ask for courage and perseverance in the long nights ahead. You call us all to turn our swords into plowshares and our spears into pruning hooks, to sow seeds of justice and freedom rather than destruction and despair. Change the hearts of those who roll their tanks through others' gardens; transform their lust for power into love of neighbor. Change our hearts, O God, whenever we turn away from the suffering of your beloved children. Embolden us to speak truth to power, renouncing violence and instead waging peace on earth. In the name of your Son, refugee and redeemer, we pray. Amen.

On Wednesday evenings beginning March 9, a group will meet from 7 - 8:30pm on Zoom to discuss the book *Love is the Way* by Presiding Bishop Michael Curry. Here's some more information about the book and the author, from the publisher:

# "Walk the path of love with one of the warmest, most beloved spiritual leaders of our time, and learn how to put faith into action.

As the descendant of slaves and the son of a civil rights activist, Bishop Michael Curry's life illustrates massive changes in our times. Much of the world met Bishop Curry when he delivered his sermon on the redemptive power of love at the royal wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle at Windsor Castle. Here, he expands on his message of hope in an inspirational road map for living the way of love, illuminated with moving lessons from his own life. Through the prism of his faith, ancestry, and personal journey, *Love Is the Way* shows us how America came this far and, more important, how to go a whole lot further. The way of love is essential for addressing the seemingly insurmountable challenges facing the world today: poverty, racism, selfishness, deep

ideological divisions, competing claims to speak for God. This book will lead readers to discover the gifts they need in order to live the way of love: deep reservoirs of hope and resilience, simple wisdom, the discipline of nonviolence, and unshakable regard for human dignity."
