This Sunday, May 22, we will have our regular 8am and 10am services. The 10am service will include a Rogation Blessing and Procession. We also have **in-person Godly Play in Room 4**, beginning at 10am. Your children will join you after the sermon in church.

An In Person Family Gathering: After the 10am service, we invite families with children 18 and under to join us in rooms 6/7 to socialize.
