Thank you all and special thanks to our parishioner volunteers who deliver the donated items to the three food closets. Let's continue with "Every Person...Every Week...One Item of Food."

#### **Living Classroom and Prayer Chalkboard on Hawthorn**

The newest addition to our outdoor classroom on the Hawthorn side of the campus is a donation of beautiful wood from Alessa Johns and Chris Reynolds. We're now entering a period of discernment—of living with the wood and listening to the space—as we decide on the best placement and use of this generous donation. Put in your name and email address, then click sign up now. You do NOT need to log in to sign up. You'll be reminded of your sign up automatically two days before the service.

# **COVID Masking Update and Clarification**
