A reading from the book of Hosea.

When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son.

The more I called them, the more they went from me;

they kept sacrificing to the Baals, and offering incense to idols.

Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them up in my arms; but they did not know that I healed them.

I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love.

SECOND READING

Colossians 3:1-11

A reading from Paul's letter to the Colossians.

If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. But now you must get rid of all such things-- anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

Then the Presider continues

Glory and honor and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favor upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus the holy child of God. Living among us, Jesus loved us. He broke bread with outcasts and sinners, healed the sick, and proclaimed good news to the poor. He yearned to draw all the world to himself yet we were heedless of his call to walk in love. ABOUT RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

All are welcome at God's table, children included. Gluten-free Communion hosts are available; please ask. Wine is being served via intinction only; the priest will dip your host into the chalice of wine and then offer it to you. If you would prefer to receive bread only, you may simply say so. The customary response upon receiving Communion is "Amen." Crossing your arms over your chest indicates that you would like to receive a blessing instead of Communion.

A note about Spiritual Communion: The Book of Common Prayer reminds us that if one is unable to actually consume the consecrated bread and wine due to extreme sickness or disability, the desire is enough for God to grant all the benefits of communion (p. 457). When being present at a celebration of the Eucharistic is not possible, this act of prayer and meditation can provide the means by which you can associate yourself with the Eucharistic Action and open yourself to God's grace and blessing. Please consider using this Act of Reception during Communion time.

In union, blessed Jesus, with the faithful gathered at every altar of your Church where your blessed Body and Blood are offered this day, and remembering particularly the people of the Church of St. Martin, I long to offer you praise and thanksgiving, for creation and all the blessings of this life, for the redemption of the world, and for the means of grace and the hope of glory. I believe that you are truly present in the Holy Sacrament, and, since I cannot at this time receive communion, I pray you to come into my heart. I unite myself with you and embrace you with all my heart, my soul, and my mind. Let nothing separate me from you; let me serve you in this life until, by your grace, I come to your glorious kingdom and unending peace. Amen.

Lambeth Conference Update

The Lambeth Conference is an international meeting of bishops from across the Anglican Communion and is convened by the Archbishop of Canterbury. This conference is held once every ten years. According to the Lambeth Conference's website, "the conference discusses church and world affairs and the global mission of the Anglican Communion for the decade ahead." The conference that had been scheduled for 2020 was delayed by two years because of the pandemic but began July 26, 2022.

Last week, the Lambeth Conference put out a Lambeth Calls study guide for bishops affirming a 24-year-old resolution opposing same-sex marriage. At the conference, bishops would be asked to indicate their views on the Calls, selecting one of two choices, "This Call speaks for me. I add my voice to it and commit myself to take the action I can to implement it." Or "This Call requires further discernment. I commit my voice to the ongoing process."

After significant uproar from bishops worldwide, particularly from the Episcopal Church, news that the Lambeth Calls were revised was announced on July 26, 2022. Among other items, the language opposing same-sex marriage was eliminated. Additionally, a third response option was added, which states "This Call does not speak to me. I do not add my voice to this Call."

Our rector Pamela+ wants to assure anyone who has concerns that we are absolutely committed to continuing our practice of full inclusion at St. Martin's, including unwavering support for marriage equality and upholding the equal worth and dignity of all members of the LGBTQIA+ community.

We at St. Martin's affirm the words of our Statement of Action and Commitment, which begins: "All are welcome at our church. We at St. Martin's are a faithful people intent on living into the words of our Baptismal Covenant, respecting the dignity and worth of **every** human being." 





