### Join Us in Watching Traces of the Trade: A Story from the Deep North

Join us on August 10 from 7 - 9pm for the film *Traces of the Trade: A Story from the Deep North*. Producer/director Katrina Browne tells the story of her forefathers, the largest slave-trading family in U.S. history. Given the myth that the South is solely responsible for slavery, viewers will be surprised to learn that Browne's ancestors were Northerners. The film follows Browne and nine fellow family members on a remarkable journey that brings them face-to-face with the history and legacy of New England's hidden enterprise. After learning her family history, Browne went on to help develop the Sacred Ground program, which some of you have experienced. #### **Lambeth Conference Update**

The Lambeth Conference is an international meeting of bishops from across the Anglican Communion and is convened by the Archbishop of Canterbury. This conference is held once every ten years. According to the Lambeth Conference's website, "the conference discusses church and world affairs and the global mission of the Anglican Communion for the decade ahead." The conference that had been scheduled for 2020 was delayed by two years because of the pandemic but began July 26, 2022.

Earlier this week, the Lambeth Conference put out a Lambeth Calls study guide for bishops affirming a 24-year-old resolution opposing same-sex marriage. At the conference, bishops would be asked to indicate their views on the Calls, selecting one of two choices, "This Call speaks for me. I add my voice to it and commit myself to take the action I can to implement it." Or "This Call requires further discernment. I commit my voice to the ongoing process."

After significant uproar from bishops worldwide, particularly from the Episcopal Church, news that the Lambeth Calls were revised was announced on July 26, 2022. Among other items, the language opposing same-sex marriage was eliminated. Additionally, a third response option was added, which states "This Call does not speak to me. I do not add my voice to this Call."

Our rector Pamela+ wants to assure anyone who has concerns that we are absolutely committed to continuing our practice of full inclusion at St. Martin's, including unwavering support for marriage equality and upholding the equal worth and dignity of all members of the LGBTQIA+ community.

We at St. Martin's affirm the words of our Statement of Action and Commitment, which begins: "All are welcome at our church. We at St. Martin's are a faithful people intent on living into the words of our Baptismal Covenant, respecting the dignity and worth of every human being." #### Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's Statements on Recent Supreme Court Decisions

Presiding Bishop Curry and the Office of Public Affairs of The National Episcopal Church recently released statements regarding two Supreme Court decisions. The court issued a decision on *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, which overturned the constitutional right to abortion recognized in *Roe v. Wade*. In *NYSRPA v.
