New and Noteworthy

Yolo County COVID-19 Transmission Level Signage

St. Martin's is now using Yolo County Health and Human Services Agency's COVID-19 transmission-level signage. The signs posted at our main entrances indicate the COVID-19 transmission level in Yolo County based on case rates, testing positivity, and levels of the virus in the wastewater. We will be checking the levels on the County website daily and posting the appropriate signage. At the time of writing, the level of COVID-19 in the community is HIGH; community transmission is also high. While not required, masks are strongly recommended indoors for everyone when COVID-19 levels are high. Yolo County will be giving St. Martin's a supply of high-quality masks (N95, KN95, and/or KF94); if you would like a mask when you come to St. Martin's, just ask and we will give you one.

Producer/director Katrina Browne tells the story of her forefathers, the largest slave-trading family in U.S. history. Given the myth that the South is solely responsible for slavery, viewers will be surprised to learn that Browne's ancestors were Northerners. The film follows Browne and nine fellow family members on a remarkable journey that brings them face-to-face with the history and legacy of New England's hidden enterprise. After learning her family
