At its annual convention this past weekend, the Episcopal Diocese of Northern California passed a climate change resolution that asks all congregations in the diocese to become carbon neutral by 2030 and to do an assessment by 2024 of what it will take for each congregation to achieve this goal. At the same convention, our rector, Pamela, was elected to serve as one of four clergy deputies from our diocese to the 81st General Convention of the Episcopal Church to be held in July of 2024 in Louisville, Kentucky.
