All Saints Day

All Saints' Day, Tuesday, November 1 at 7:00pm: Join us for an All Saints' Day Holy Eucharist and a reading of the Necrology (which commemorates our loved ones who have departed in the past year). At this time we will also begin creating our *ofrenda* in anticipation of our November 6 Dia de los Muertos celebration; see below for more information.

For over 30 years, St. Martin's has collected donations at this time of year to help families in our community have a wonderful and abundant Thanksgiving meal. In the early years, baskets of non-

perishable food were distributed. More recently, the project converted to the purchase of grocery store gift cards, which allows the families and students who receive them to purchase the food that they want to prepare and serve on their own time. Last year, we were able to provide \$100 gift cards to 88 families and \$25 gift cards to 32 students.

News From Diocesan Convention

At its annual convention this past weekend, the Episcopal Diocese of Northern California passed a climate change resolution that asks all congregations in the diocese to become carbon neutral by 2030 and to do an assessment by 2024 of what it will take for each congregation to achieve this goal. We thank Rev. Pamela and Juliette Beck plus a number of others from the Diocese for putting this resolution forward. It will be the work of churches like St. Martin's, who are already carbon neutral, to assist other churches, as needed, with their assessments and energy audits. We at St. Martin's stand ready to help! At the same convention, our rector, Pamela, was elected to serve as one of four clergy deputies from our diocese to the 81st General Convention of the Episcopal Church to be held in July of 2024 in Louisville, Kentucky. She will provide descriptions and examples of strategies and policies a community can use to challenge racial segregation and promote inclusive housing. Eucharistic Visitor Ministry Replaces Shared Home Communion

Shared Home Communion (the distribution of pre-consecrated wafers for consumption at the appointed time while participating in a live-streamed service of Holy Eucharist) was a pastoral response to the public health emergency that required churches to stop holding in-person worship services due to the threat posed by COVID. But fortunately we are in a different phase of the pandemic and have resumed not only in-person worship but also our Eucharistic Visitor ministry. We are thus ending the Shared Home Communion program, with deep gratitude to all who made it possible. Hybrid worship, the St. Martin's Messengers, and other ways to stay connected to those who can't be at church in person are all continuing and, in some cases, may even expand as needed. We have postponed these offerings and will start Revive small groups in the New Year. Please see the letter below from Rev. Pamela.

Dear Ones,

They say that in real estate, location is everything. In the rest of life, it seems to be all about timing!

Our very busy fall schedule has perhaps been a tad overly ambitious. (There are times when my enthusiasm gets the best of me!) I've received lots of feedback that people are interested in a retreat and in the Revive program but the timing is just not right. So, we are regrouping with a new plan.

We will start Revive small groups in the New Year. We will still begin with a retreat, but it will be nearby (or maybe onsite) and not require an overnight. This will also help accommodate people who still need to be extra careful about COVID precautions, or for whom a long drive is not feasible. It will also cut down on expenses.

Meanwhile, there will be different offerings for Wednesday nights in November and December. Keep your eyes open for that information, coming soon! And we'll send out the specifics about Revive and the retreat very soon as well, so that everyone has plenty of time to plan ahead.
