The Feast of St. Martin and Ingathering, This Sunday November 13

Sunday we celebrate the feast of our patron saint, St. Martin of Tours. Martin was a soldier and a conscientious objector, a great leader yet someone who did not want to be elevated to the order of Bishop. Martin is a complicated, wonderful saint who helps remind us there are many ways to follow Jesus and love our neighbor. We will also be recognizing Veterans' Day at both services with a special prayer at 8am and a national song at 10am. Come celebrate together!

Sunday is also our **stewardship ingathering day**, where we ask you to bring your 2023 pledges to church to submit them in person and have them blessed. Remember, a pledge is an estimate of what you will be able to contribute financially to the parish and is critical to our budget-planning process. A Conversation about Housing, November 17, 6:30pm, Congregation Bet Haverim

On Thursday, November 17, at 6:30pm Interfaith Housing Justice Davis and The League of Women Voters Davis Area invite you to a discussion about solutions, in our own communities, to undo racial segregation and begin to repair the harms it has caused. Leah Rothstein will set the stage with her soon to be published book, *Just Action: Creating a Movement That Can End Segregation Enacted Under the Color of Law* by Richard Rothstein and Leah Rothstein. She will provide descriptions and examples of strategies and policies a community can use to challenge racial segregation and promote inclusive housing. Peace and Justice Film Series Beginning
