First Film in Peace and Justice Film Series, November 23, 7pm

We're excited to begin collaborating in monthly film discussions with another Episcopal parish—Messiah in Santa Ana. The first movie in this shared program will be <u>Ayotzinapa - el paso de la tortuga</u> on Wednesday, November 23 at 7:00pm. The film is a documentary on the 2014 forced disappearance of 43 students from the Ayotzinapa Rural Teachers' College and the highly controversial government investigation that followed.
