This Sunday, December 11, will be our last regular Godly Play class for the year. It has been such a pleasure to acquaint and reacquaint ourselves with your children, tell stories, and "wonder" together. Beginning in January, we will hold **Godly Play three times a month – the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Sundays – during the 10:00am service, with the first Sunday of the month designated as a "First Sunday" intergenerational service. "Christmas Plate" offerings are special donations by parishioners intended to bring an added boost of financial support to an organization serving individuals and/or families in great need.

We invite parishioners to nominate a recipient organization for 2022. Nonprofit organizations that serve the most needy among us are our highest priority. We are targeting organizations that directly serve individuals and families that are dealing with food insecurity, housing insecurity, mental health issues, and other such needs. While we generally fund organizations in our community or diocese, there is no geographic restriction.

Other Important Updates

New Yolo County Masking Recommendations and Signage

Yolo County is now recommending that everyone 2 years of age and older wear a mask indoors this Winter as several respiratory viruses are spreading, including influenza, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), and COVID. The County has also changed their signage to reflect that masking

recommendations are now based on combined respiratory virus levels rather than a single virus. For this reason, we have replaced our older signs with Yolo County's new red signs. While masking will continue to be recommended only at St. Martin's, we have two types of masks available for anyone who needs one (medical and KN95 masks). The County recommends high quality N95, KN95, and KF94 masks for the best protection.
