Learning Opportunities during Epiphany

Brigid of Kildare–A Special Class on Wednesday, Feb 1: Want to learn about one of history's most intriguing holy women? St. Brigid's feast day is February 1. Brigid of Kildare is known as the patron saint of poets, scholars, midwives, and farmers. Her hagiography is intertwined with that of a Celtic goddess and many of the legends and rituals associated with her inhabit that liminal zone between pagan and Christian beliefs and practices. We'll start with a candlelight labyrinth walk at 6:30 and then start the class and conversation at 7 in Room 6/7. Weather permitting, we might even have a small bonfire in her honor and toast with a glass of beer (or root beer!). This will be an inperson event led by Rev.
