## This Sunday! Godly Play at 10:00am

This Sunday, January 29, we'll have Godly Play for children ages K - 6th grade in Room 4. We are now holding **Godly Play three times a month – the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 4<sup>th</sup> Sundays of the month** – **during the 10:00am service**, with the first Sunday of the month designated as a "First Sunday" service, which means it is more interactive and more accessible to a wide variety of ages. ### The Nursery is Open

### Wondering Why We Sometimes Wear Orange Stoles?

Orange stoles were designated by Bishops United Against Gun Violence as a sign that the church stands against gun violence and advocates for changes to laws and our culture—changes needed to make us safer. You will often see orange stoles worn after significant incidents of gun violence, whether local or not. We at St. Martin's pray for all the victims of the recent mass shootings in California and for their families and loved ones.

#### Yolo Interfaith Alliance for Climate Justice (YIACJ) Information Session This Sunday

An initiative organized by "Third Act," Bill McKibben's climate group for seniors, is encouraging people around the country to do all they can to stop four major banks (Chase, Wells Fargo, Bank of America, and Citibank) from continuing to loan money to fossil fuel companies. YIACJ Chair Lynne Nittler, and UCD Professor Emerita of Classics, Emily Albu, are spreading the word to increase participation in the upcoming initiative: It will involve members of congregations across the nation joining the March 23 action to cut up their credit cards from the four banks, who together have spent *three trillion dollars in loans to fossil fuel companies* since the Paris Climate Accord: https://thirdact.org/our-work/banking-on-our-future/. Lynne and Emily will explain the action, offer advice about preparing for it (how to close an account, how to choose a new "green" bank, etc.), and describe the YIACJ activities that will lead up to the March 21 event. ## Brigid of Kildare–Wednesday, February 1 at 6:30pm

Want to learn about one of history's most intriguing holy women? St. Brigid's feast day is February 1. Brigid of Kildare is known as the patron saint of poets, scholars, midwives, and farmers. Her hagiography is intertwined with that of a Celtic goddess and many of the legends and rituals associated with her inhabit that liminal zone between pagan and Christian beliefs and practices. We'll start with a candlelight labyrinth walk at 6:30 and then start the class and conversation at 7 in Room 6/7. Weather permitting, we might even have a small bonfire in her honor and toast with a glass of beer (or rootbeer!). This will be an in-person event led by Rev. Pamela.

#### I Will, with God's Help: Journey Toward Racial Healing and Justice

This one-day, in-person workshop was specially developed for the Episcopal Diocese of Northern California by the Commission on Intercultural Ministries. Renew your Baptismal Covenant as we learn about forms of historic and contemporary racism and how to engage in ministry with sensitivity and respect for all. Please note that due to the nature of the program, attendance is limited to 30 participants. Lunch donation of \$10 (cash or check) on the day of workshop is requested. Attendance at this workshop fulfills the racial reconciliation requirement needed for many ministries in the church, including staff, clergy, Eucharistic Ministers, Eucharistic Visitors, Healing Ministers, Messengers, Godly Play, Nursery, and Youth Volunteers, and Convention Delegates.
