Sunday Afternoon, June 18 at 4pm – Rev. Betsy’s Ordination to the Priesthood

God willing and the people consenting, the Rev. Betsy McElroy will be ordained to the priesthood here at St. Martin’s on Sunday, June 18 at 4pm. A reception will follow in the parish hall. **We will be giving Betsy an ordination gift.** To donate towards this gift, you can write a check to The Church of St. Martin with memo “Gift for Betsy” and drop it in the offering plate or mail it to the office. Rev. Pamela’s Sabbatical Starts Monday, June 19

Rev. Pamela will be on sabbatical from June 19 to September 18. This is an important time in the life cycle of a parish; every five years, per diocesan letters of agreement, the rector is expected to take a three-month break from the daily routine of running a parish in order to come back with fresh eyes and a renewed spirit. That fancy title means that Debbie will do most of the preaching and presiding on Sundays and help coordinate important ministries like pastoral care. It is important to note that Debbie will be half time, meaning that the Vestry—and especially the wardens—will have more duties and responsibilities during this time. Please support them through your prayers, your own offers of help, and your patience if things feel a little different from time to time. All of us who have benefited from Rev. Debbie’s stellar preaching and grounded presence know we are in good hands this summer!

Oliver just graduated with a Bachelor of Music in Organ Performance from St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota.
