St. Martin's in the News!

As part of their series, "Growing a Green Church," the Episcopal News Service published an article on St. Martin's journey to becoming carbon neutral. They write, "By 2018, St. Martin's had reduced its carbon footprint by about 60%, its annual natural gas bill by 50% and grid electricity bills by 75%, with overall energy costs reduced by nearly 20%...The church's solar panels connect to Pacific Gas & Electric's grid, which supplies electricity via renewables including the sun, wind and water. With the switch to an all-electric HVAC system and the 2021 installation of the last solar array on the roof of the Sunday school classroom building, St. Martin's achieved net-zero carbon."
