## **Godly Play**

#### Music Notes for Sunday, September 17 from Our Choir Director

A portion of Sunday's Gospel reading was set to music by Sebastian Homo in the mid-17th century: "You wicked servant! I forgave you all [your] debt because you pleaded with me. Should you not have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?" All that we know of this composer are his dozen or so compositions included in a 1617 anthology—He was in good company; also included were works by Giovanni and Andrea Gabrielli, Philippe de Monte, and Palestrina, among others. Homo composed "Serve Nequam" in an old-fashioned, conservative style, perhaps as a gesture to the stark text. However, his own zeitgeist is apparent from the opening, in which chains of falling fourths evoke a sorrow too deep for the text alone to bear.

## This Sunday! St. Matthew's Center 80th Anniversary - 1pm Open House

Founded in 1943, St. Matthew's Episcopal Church has served the Arden Arcade community of Sacramento County for eighty years. In 2016, the Diocese of Northern California established the Center at St. Matthew's as a diocesan community center and outreach ministry. The Center houses Highlands Adult School (offering English language and literacy classes to more than 300 refugees and immigrants every weekday) and River City Food Bank (serving over 3000 people per week). The Center also helps lead Arden Arcade HART (Homeless Assistance Resource Team). The spiritual heart of the Center is the Mission at St. Matthew's, which has faithfully served the community for eight decades. All are cordially invited to help celebrate the mission's 80th anniversary. Worship will be at 10am, with Bishop Megan presiding, followed by a potluck.
