Music Notes for This Sunday, September 24

Today's music not only reflects the Lectionary, but also celebrates the sabbatical return of our rector. We are opening with a processional that the clergy and staff think of as "our hymn" at St Martin's, "Earth and all stars," whose text is perfect for a church in a university town. We have also included one of Pamela's favorite hymns, "I come with joy to meet my Lord," during Communion. Its tune, *Land of Rest*, is an American folk melody with deep roots in Celtic Britain. The choir anthem will comment upon issues raised in the readings with Mark Schweizer's contemporary setting of a poem by the 17th-century mystic, George Herbert.

Heat, Health, and Racial Justice: A Free Online Discussion, Thursday, September 28

The summer of 2023 was the hottest ever recorded, increasing the risk of heat-related illnesses. While the rising number of heat waves will affect everyone to some capacity, this discussion will dive into the impacts heat has on our public health and how BIPOC communities (Black, Indigenous, people of color) are disproportionately at risk due to the oppressive systems in our institutions and society. CDSP to Host Panel Discussion on Open Communion, October 9, 4-6pm

On October 9th from 4-6pm, Church Divinity School of the Pacific (CDSP) will partner with the Diocese of Northern California in a discussion of the proposal to repeal CANON I.17.7 of the Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church, which states: "No unbaptized person shall be eligible to receive Holy Communion in this Church." The proposal, which never made it out of committee at the 80th General Convention, created much discussion and controversy. At this event, titled *Canon, Communion, and Controversy*, the panel of speakers will be Bishop Megan Traquair, The Rev. Br. Simeon (Lewis) Powell, The Rev. James Richardson, and the Rev.
