This Sunday October 29, Día de los Muertos

Sunday we celebrate Día de los Muertos! At the 10am service, we have special music and, in the narthex, an ofrenda with photos and mementos of loved ones who have passed away. Please be sure to stay for coffee hour after the 10am service. We will have pan dulce and a piñata during coffee hour. Kids and adults alike are invited to wear a costume! Music Notes for Sunday, October 29

The Offertory anthem for October 29 is the "Credo" from Carol Barnett's "World Beloved: A Bluegrass Mass," the entirety of which we will present this spring, accompanied by bluegrass instruments. Musically, this work fuses classical structure with folk idioms; poetically, the text, provided by poet Marisha Chamberlain, explores the love of God through the rich metaphorical language of creation. The "Credo," like many of the movements, cannot replace the liturgy; rather than our normal Creed, this "Credo" is a poetic statement of belief in the continuity of life, using the metaphor of a river. We offer this on Día de los Muertos as a reminder that, on the journey down the river of life, there will be people we leave behind and people we will meet again, and no one goes alone.
