#### Music Notes for Sunday, November 12

Today's processional hymn was inspired by the Gospel parable of the wise and foolish virgins. The melody was composed by Hans Sachs, but the structure, harmonization and striding bassline in our hymnal were written by J.S. Bach, for his cantata BWV 140, "Wachet auf." It is a joyful hymn but carries a note of forthright caution (its very title means "Wake up!" or "Look out!"). Our offertory anthem revisits this chorale; composer John Horman lightens the cautionary tone with a graceful counter-melody and cheerful accompaniment. One of our Communion hymns, "Cuando pobre nada tiene," was chosen in honor of St. Martin and his acts of charity. "When the poor one who has nothing shares with strangers," the hymn tells us, "then we know that God is still with us."
