Music Notes for Sunday, November 26

For November 26, Jeffrey has chosen prelude and postlude music by English composer Henry Purcell (1659-1695) to complement Purcell's verse anthem "Rejoice in the Lord Alway," known familiarly as "The Bell Anthem." This nickname comes from the introduction, which evokes change-ringers preparing for a peal. We will sing a shortened version of this lengthy work, leaving out most of the instrumental interludes. The musical form "verse anthem" is an Anglican convention, in which the text is divided between soloists and choir. There are three types of verse anthem, one of which treats the choir sections as an antiphon or refrain; this is the type to which our offertory belongs. We present this special work in honor of Christ the King. Our thanks to Mark Grote, baritone, who joins alto Elise Keddie and tenor Neil Willits in the solo trio.

Advent Living Compass Class

A Very Special First Sunday Advent Service on December 3

On Sunday, December 3 at our 10am service we will celebrate an Advent Lessons and Carols service with a focus on Our Lady of Guadalupe, who is considered by many the Patron Saint of the Americas. We'll enjoy extra special music, with guest musicians and the Pop-Up Choir. An

activity for young children will be offered during the service, so please bring your whole family and invite friends! The service will be followed immediately by *Las Posadas*, a re-enactment of Joseph and Mary's search for a place to stay. *Las Posadas* is a venerable Mexican custom, celebrating the journey of the Holy Family to Bethlehem. It is fun for all generations and will conclude with a special coffee hour/fiesta featuring pan dulce, hot chocolate, and an old-fashioned carol-sing.
