## A Very Special "First Sunday" Advent Service This Sunday

On Sunday, December 3, at our 10am service, we will celebrate an Advent Lessons and Carols service with a focus on Our Lady of Guadalupe, who is considered by many the Patron Saint of the Americas. We'll enjoy extra special music, with guest musicians and the Pop-Up Choir. During the first half of the service, children will have the option of gathering in the narthex with Godly Play teachers to make Christmas ornaments, so bring your whole family!

The service will be followed immediately by *Las Posadas*, a re-enactment of Joseph and Mary's search for a place to stay. *Las Posadas* is a venerable Mexican custom, celebrating the journey of the Holy Family to Bethlehem. It is fun for all generations and will conclude with a special coffee hour/fiesta featuring pan dulce, hot chocolate, and an old-fashioned carol-sing. During the "fiesta," children will be able to make Advent Wreaths to take home.

#### Music Notes for Sunday, December 3

Last year, our Advent Lessons and Carols service was a meditation on *Las Posadas*, or the journey to Bethlehem. This year on December 3, we are expanding this idea to include a liturgy celebrating Our Lady of Guadalupe, whose festival day is December 12, and who is beloved as a champion of the oppressed. The Sanctuary Choir will sing music of the Spanish Colonial era in languages of the occupied (Quechua, Nahuatl, Spanish, and Mono Paiute) and the Pop-Up Choir will teach the congregation the *Las Posadas* song. We will be joined by David Avila on guitar, plus a professional early music wind ensemble playing recorders, dulcians, and shawms.

Members of our own congregation will perform on primitive percussion instruments during "Asi Andando," or "Thus it Comes," a song about the Virgin's childbirth pains by Mayan composer Max Quin ("Mahsh Keen"), known by his Christian name Tomás Pascual. Our processional, "Hanacpachap Cussicuinin," was first published in Peru in 1631. This anonymous hymn in the Quechua language praises the Virgin Mary using metaphors of nature drawn from the Quechua culture. "Xicochi conetzintle" is a Christmas lullaby to the Christ child, composed in the Nahuatl language by Gaspar Fernandes in the early 17th century. Fernandes was well-known as a singer and organist in Guatemala and Mexico. Immediately after the service, we will hold *Las Posadas*, where we follow "Mary" and "Joseph" as they sing and stroll, reenacting their search for hospitality. When they are finally welcomed inside, they will be met with a fiesta featuring carol singing and treats.

## SING Community Walk and Hot Cocoa on Sunday, December 10, at 4pm

Take a break from the pre-Christmas stress with a neighborhood walk and some relaxed time with your parish family. We'll meet at Sycamore Park at 4pm, walk through the neighborhood—with a couple of stops for thought-provoking poetry and Bible passages—and end at St. Martin's for a cup of cocoa and conversation about nature and spirituality in the winter months. The event will wrap up with (optional) Evening Prayer at 5:30pm; you'll be done in time for dinner or whatever errands, parties, or other events your night holds!
