Greening of the Church, This Sunday, December 17 after 10am Service

This Sunday, December 17, after the 10am service, please stay to help us decorate the church for Christmas. We'll decorate the Christmas tree, place candles, and hang garlands, wreaths, and lights. Many hands make light work. And it is a perfect opportunity to enjoy time with fellow parishioners.

Blue Christmas Service, This Sunday, December 17 at 4pm

This Sunday, December 17, at 4pm, we will be offering a Blue Christmas Service. This is a service of prayer, music, candle lighting, and contemplation and is especially designed for those who might not be feeling the joy of this holiday season. Healing prayers will also be available for those who want them. Please join us for this service, which lasts about 45 minutes.

Morning Prayer During Advent

On Wednesday mornings at 8:30am, Rev. Pamela is leading Morning Prayer in the narthex. Attending this 25-minute service is a wonderful way to start your day during this time of waiting and contemplation. Our last Advent Morning Prayer service is December 20. Music Notes for Sunday, December 17

On December 17, we will use two hymns from the Episcopal hymnal, "Voices Found," a collection composed by, about, or for women. The text to our Offertory anthem, "The Grain is Ripe," was written by Shirley Erena Murray (b. 1931), a prolific hymn writer from New Zealand who has published three collections. The same spiritual impulses which guide Murray's activism on behalf of Amnesty International and in service to the Labor Party Research Unit of the New Zealand Parliament are expressed in her hymn texts, which tend toward women's concerns, justice, peace, creation, and unity. One of our Communion hymns, "My soul gives glory to my God," is a paraphrase of the Magnificat, written by Sister Miriam Therese Winter (b. Gloria Winter, 1938), a Medical Mission Sister who is Professor of Liturgy, Worship, Spirituality, and Feminist Studies at Hartford International University for Religion and Peace. Sr. Miriam composed several folk-style hymns during the 1960s, 70s, and 80s, including "Joy is Like the Rain," made popular on the radio. "My soul gives glory to my God" is set to a very early 19th century tune attributed to Elkanah Dare but probably of folk origin. Although provided with keyboard accompaniment in "Voices Found," we have chosen a musical treatment that emphasizes the tune's similarity to certain medieval dance tunes.
