Sunday! St. Martin's Annual Meeting and Report—One 10am Service Only

This Sunday, January 28, we will have ONE service only, at 10 am. Be there to hear updates on our ministries and our budget and to help elect Vestry members and Diocesan Convention delegates. As Rev. Ernie said in his sermon last week, let's all participate—together!

While the 10am service will be in–person and livestreamed on Zoom and Facebook live, and recorded in the usual manner for YouTube, the Annual Meeting will be in-person and only streamed on Zoom with no recording. Many thanks to all who signed up to bring food; there will be tables in the narthex ready to receive your goodies before church starts at 10am. See you there!

Music Notes for January 28

In our Old Testament lesson for January 28, Moses assures his people that a great prophet shall arise from among them, one who will carry God's own message—a prophet, we are warned, who should be taken seriously. Our Gospel reading shows us Jesus in the synagogue at Capernaum, teaching and healing with just such a prophetic authority. Our Communion hymns address Jesus as both healer and teacher. Our offertory anthem, "I Hear the Prophet Callin'," by Pepper Choplin, is based on passages from Isaiah 35 and 40, familiar to us from Advent: "Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf will hear, the mute will shout for joy." Jesus, St. Paul reminds us in the New Testament reading, came to fulfill the law, freeing us for a new kind of relationship with God. Our closing hymn, "The Church's one foundation," is a fitting response, and reminds us of who we are as we move into the Annual Meeting immediately following.
