# **Celebrate Candlemas This Sunday**

This Sunday, February 4, at 10am, for our "First Sunday" service, we will celebrate the ancient church custom of blessing candles and learn about this meaningful time in the church year. Please bring a candle from home to be blessed (we'll have some on hand for those who forget). We'll even have some special snacks during coffee hour. We will also be blessing candles at the 8am service.

#### Music Notes for Sunday, February 4

Have you ever wondered about the origins of Groundhog Day? February 2 is halfway between the winter solstice and the spring equinox and long ago was celebrated as the time people in the northern hemisphere begin to notice the lengthening of days. It was considered a time to think about the future and rejoice in the hope we place in our younger generation. In Ireland, the young St. Brigid was venerated as an image of this hope. The church honors this time of year by commemorating Mary's purification at the temple and the Presentation of Jesus. It is also Candlemas, when the church blessed its candles to honor the light of Christ reflected in creation and to prepare the Paschal Candle for the duties lying ahead. On February 4, our First Sunday service will celebrate Candlemas with a blessing of the candles and a rousing Pop-Up Choir anthem, easy to sing and fun to learn. Come to the church at 9:30am on Sunday to rehearse.

#### **Singers Needed for April Choir Concert**

We know there are those of you who can read music but who can't commit to the choir on a permanent basis. If you'd like more challenging music than the Pop-Up Choir but can't commit to the Sanctuary Choir, you can join us for a short-term commitment by singing with us in the spring concert we are preparing. Beginning on February 8, on Thursdays from 7 to 7:30pm, the choir rehearsal will be devoted to learning **The World Beloved: A Bluegrass Mass,** by Carol Barnett, which we hope to present on the afternoon of April 21. From 7:30pm on, those who would like to join us on Sunday mornings are welcome to stay.

#### Ash Wednesday Services with Imposition of Ashes

Lent begins on Wednesday, February 14. We will have Holy Eucharist with the Imposition of Ashes at 7am and 7pm. The 7am service will be shorter than the usual Sunday service to accommodate those who need to get to work. At 12 noon we will have a brief "ashes to go" prayer service on the labyrinth, weather permitting. At 7pm, the service will be both in person and livestreamed. #### Update on the Ceiling Stained-Glass Window in the Church

You may have noticed signs of maintenance work being done on the ceiling stained-glass window in the church, including the scaffolding around the altar area, and just this week, a large piece of plastic in front of the organ pipes. The plastic is to prevent any debris that might fall into the organ pipes when the damaged panel of glass is removed. Due to illness, Nzilani Glass Restoration was not able to come last week as planned to remove the panel. But weather permitting, they will be here on Wednesday, February 7.
