Bell Ringing at Start of 10am Service in Recognition of our Climate-Changed World

In honor of Earth Day, we will start the 10am service on Sunday, April 21 by ringing bells for 7 minutes and 8 seconds. This amount of time equals 425 seconds, which represents the current level of CO2 (in parts per million) in the earth's atmosphere, the highest in millions of years. Please join us outside the narthex a few minutes before 10am so that we may begin together in prayer; you may take part in a procession around the Great Lawn, led by Rev. Pamela and the choir, or stay gathered either inside or outside the church during this time of prayer. Please maintain silence during the procession if you are not ringing bells, as this is an occasion for prayers of lament as well as hope.

Music Notes for Sunday, April 21

Our morning offertory anthem is taken from Carol Barnett's "The World Beloved: A Bluegrass Mass," with words by Marisha Chamberlain. At 4pm, will be joined by guest musicians on fiddle, mandolin, and guitar to present the entire mass. Also on the program will be poetry from Maurice Manning's collection "Bucolics," read for us by the Rev. Ernie Lewis. These psalm-like poems are composed in the earthy language of a southern sharecropper speaking to his landlord. The concert is offered in honor of Earth Day; admission is free. This week we also traditionally celebrate Christ as Good Shepherd in the worship service, and our hymns were chosen with this in heart and mind.

Fearless Faith Revival

On April 26 - 27, The Diocese of Northern California will hold a Fearless Faith Revival. An Episcopal revival is a series of gatherings that combine worship, teaching, faith-sharing, intensified prayer, and engagement with the mission of God.
