### Music Notes for Sunday, September 22

On September 22, our celebration of the Season of Creation continues with an offertory anthem by Charles McCartha, "Awaken Creation." From the joyful opening fanfare to the dancelike middle section, this exuberant anthem calls upon all creation to praise God. Our Epistle and Gospel readings are reflected in the Communion hymn, "These three are the treasures." The words and music were composed by Colin Hodgetts (b.1940). A socially active Anglican priest, Hodgetts worked with the poor and refugees in England during the 1970s through the 1990s. He later traveled extensively in Asia, studying music and culture, and this interest is reflected in the hymn's tune, *The Song of Lao Tsu*, as well as its text, which is based on a quote from philosopher Lao Tsu: "I have just three things to teach: simplicity, patience, compassion. These three are your greatest treasures."

## **Christian Formation Opportunity - Starts This Tuesday, September 24**

Rev. Pamela and Miriam Casey of the Commission on the Environment will lead a new curriculum from the Presiding Bishop's office called, "Love God, Love God's World." Sessions include compelling films and readings, faith-based reflections, and discussion questions. Participants will also discover ways to learn, pray, advocate, and conserve. The course will begin on September 24 and continue every two weeks on Tuesdays (with a break in December). All will be on Zoom, from 7 to 8:30pm. #### Worship in the Parish Hall beginning Sunday, September 29

The cleaning and restoration of our ceiling stained-glass window will begin this coming Monday, September 23, making September 22 our last Sunday in the church until the project is complete. Rest assured that all of our Sunday services will continue in the parish hall, uninterrupted and at their regular times. We are working hard to make sure all goes smoothly but wanted to let you know to expect the following changes during our time in the parish hall:

The deacon will not be reading individual prayer requests in church. These requests will still be prayed during the week. Also, we will allow ample time during services for you to share individual prayer requests either silently or aloud.

We will be reserving space for wheelchairs, walkers, and individuals with limited mobility along the side aisles on both sides of the parish hall.

The choir will be seated in the back section of the parish hall. This allows them to be close to the piano and to our music directors.

*The choir will be rehearsing in the Dona Brandon music room* starting on Thursday, September 26 at 7pm.

Eucharistic ministers and acolytes should bring their white albs to the office. We will have a clothes rack for you to place them on, and they will be available to you on Sundays. We will be using Rev. Ernie's and Rev. Debbie's office as a vesting room.

We will need ONE volunteer parishioner each Saturday (9/29, 10/6, 10/13, and 10/20) to help set up at 2pm. You will be working with three other people who will show you the ropes. We will also need help in putting away chairs after the 10am service on Sundays. We hope that those who are able will help us. This should go quickly.
