On Sunday, October 27, we will celebrate Día de los Muertos, our Stewardship Ingathering, and Belfry Sunday. We will welcome the Rev. Dr. Portia Hopkins, chaplain of The Belfry, to preach. Plan to stay for a Dos Coyotes lunch after the 10am service (hosted by St. Martin's) and join in the festivities, which will include making sugar skulls and other activities. You won't want to miss this big celebration!

For Día de los Muertos, we will have a traditional *ofrenda* (an altar). Please bring photos or mementos of loved ones who have passed away. We will display these for one Sunday only, so you can bring them and place them on the *ofrenda* and take them with you at the end of the morning. If you don't have a picture or memento you wish to remember on that day, there will still be an opportunity for remembrance during the service.

Music Notes for Sunday, October 20

On October 20, the choir's offertory anthem is "One at the Feast," by Craig Courtney, an American composer, pianist, and educator. His compositions feature lyrical melodies and accessible harmonies, usually set to a sensitive piano accompaniment that lends emotional depth to the vocal lines. In our Gospel passage today, Jesus admonishes his followers against engaging in power struggles with each other, and for trying to impose hierarchy among the faithful. Courtney's anthem, "One at the Feast," addresses this directly with themes of communion and inclusion, emphasizing the idea that, in the spirit of Christ's love, all are welcome and that true leadership in the faith requires humility rather than power. Our communion hymn, "The servant well-pleasing to God" (words and music by AnnaMae Meyer Bush), is from *Voices Found*, an Episcopal hymnal featuring compositions about, for, or by women. "The servant well-pleasing to God" reminds us that our service and offerings best please God when given freely, without ego, and with no thought of acknowledgement or return.

"Make Me an Instrument of Peace: A Guide to Civil Discourse," Sunday at 11:30am

On October 20, Rev. Pamela will offer another class in a series designed to be helpful during the election season and the generally contentious times in which we find ourselves. We'll meet in **Room 6/7 at 11:30am** to watch and discuss short videos on topics such as "Context Matters"

and "Tenets for Civil Discourse." Grab coffee and a treat at coffee hour and then join us at 11:30 for one hour. This is a drop-in class; come when you can, as you are, ready to listen deeply and be heard with respect. We will NOT hold class on October 27, so that everyone can enjoy the after-church festivities that day. The last two classes will be on November 3 and 10.
