Seeking Singers for Lessons and Carols

If you are a confident singer, quick learner, and enjoy both vocal jazz with close harmonies and Renaissance polyphony, you might enjoy taking part in our Lessons and Carols service on December 8 at 4pm (dress rehearsal December 5). We will have readings from Scripture and the writings of John Muir, and will be joined by a viol (gamba) consort. Even if you can't commit to joining the choir on a permanent basis, please feel free to join us at 7pm on Thursdays; we will begin our rehearsals with the Advent music for December 8, so you don't have to stay for the whole time.

Music Notes for Sunday, November 17

You may have noticed we have been choosing a lot of American music lately! This morning, our offertory anthem by Denise Foster Kimble is an arrangement of the 19th-century hymn "The Morning Trumpet," which originated in the shape-note singing tradition and can be found in the shape-note collection **Sacred Harp**. The tune is powerful and solemn, characterized by a haunting, martial quality. There are ten verses in the original hymn (attributed to B.F. White), tying together many biblical references of the Last Days and signs of the second coming of Christ. Composer Denise Foster Kimble has chosen to set four verses, using a musical style respectful of the hymn's origins. This anthem amplifies our Gospel reading, in which Jesus warns his disciples of trials to come. The text of "The Morning Trumpet" reflects the gravity of Jesus' words, while simultaneously expressing joyful anticipation at the prospect of his coming. In keeping with our theme of American music, our postlude includes the hymn "Down to the River to Pray." This hymn is not of shape-note origin but is African American. The earliest version, "The Good Old Way," was included in the 1867 collection **Slave Songs of the United States**.
