This Sunday! Return to Worshipping in the Church

Nzilani Glass Conservation's work on the ceiling stained-glass window is complete. The scaffolding has come down, and we will be back in the church on Sunday, December 22, the fourth Sunday of Advent. You will also be able to see the brilliance of the ceiling stained-glass window, now that it has been cleaned, cracks filled, and the pieces that fell reinstalled. Netting, which is completely "reversible," meaning it can be removed if ever needed, has also been placed under the window for extra safety. Ariana Makau, the principal conservator for Nzilani, will be back at St. Martin's to give a talk to all in the congregation who are interested on **Sunday, January 19 after the 10am service. She will have pictures and will talk about our window and the restoration work that has been done.** You will not want to miss this chance to learn more about our beautiful ceiling window!

Music Notes for Sunday, December 22

This Fourth Sunday of Advent, the liturgy includes the Magnificat, or the "Song of Mary," a canticle based on the words of Mary in the Gospel of Luke. A canticle is a scriptural hymn or song that is not a Psalm. The Magnificat is Mary's song of praise, an expression of faith, hope, and joy, celebrating God's plan of mercy and salvation. The Magnificat was likely used in early Christian worship. Certainly it was a standard part of the liturgy by the Middle Ages and remains important in both Catholic and Protestant worship. In our offertory anthem "The Coming Joy," composer Joseph M. Martin (b. 1959) has inventively combined two familiar but contrasting Christmas carols, "Ding Dong, Merrily on High" and "Good King Wenceslas," as a setting for a metrical version of the text, expressing both the exultation and the humility of Mary's words.

Two Grants Received

St. Martin's recently received two grants from the Diocese of Northern California, the first for \$1,000 to get us started on making our outdoor signage bilingual in Spanish and English. The second, for \$2,500, is to purchase a plug-in that would make our website multilingual with the target language being Spanish and to partially pay for proofreading of the Spanish translation. St. Martin's celebrates Latino language and culture in various ways in our worship and events. These improvements will greatly enhance our welcome and visibility to the Latino population and show our openness to cultural diversity.
