Good Friday: The Way of the Cross April 18, 2025 at 12pm

PLACEMENT OF THE CROSS

Please stand, as you are able.

A wooden cross will be brought into the church and placed in the sight of the people.

OPENING DEVOTIONS

Presider In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Presider Lord, have mercy.

People Christ, have mercy.

Presider Lord, have mercy.

Presider and People

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your Name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial, and deliver us from evil.

Leader	We will glory in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ:
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- *People* In whom is our salvation, our life and resurrection.
- *Presider* Let us pray. Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

You may stay in your seat or move with the clergy from station to station during the meditations.

FIRST STATION: Jesus is condemned to death

Presider	We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:
People	Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.
Reader 1	As soon as it was morning, the chief priests, with the elders and scribes, and the whole council, held a consultation; and they bound Jesus and led him away and delivered him to Pilate. And they all condemned him and said, "He deserves to die." When Pilate heard these words, he brought Jesus out and sat down on the judgment seat at a place called the Pavement, but in the Hebrew, Gabbatha. Then he handed Jesus over to them to be crucified.
Presider	God did not spare his own Son:
People	But delivered him up for us all.
Presider	Let us pray Almighty God, whose most dear Son went not up to joy but first he suffered pain

Presider Let us pray. Almighty God, whose most dear Son went not up to joy but first he suffered pain, and entered not into glory before he was crucified: Mercifully grant that we, walking in the way

of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. **Amen.**

People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

SECOND STATION: Jesus accepts his cross

- *Presider* We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:
- *People* **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**
- *Reader 2* Jesus went out, bearing his own cross, to the place called the place of a skull, which is called in Hebrew, Golgotha. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered. Like a lamb he was led to the slaughter; and like a sheep that before its shearers is mute, so he opened not his mouth. Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and riches and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and blessing.

Presider The Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all:

People For the transgression of my people was he stricken.

- *Presider* Let us pray. Almighty God, whose beloved Son willingly endured the agony and shame of the cross for our redemption: Give us courage to take up our cross and follow him; who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**
- People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

THIRD STATION: Jesus falls the first time

- *Presider* We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:
- *People* **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**
- *Reader 3* Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped; but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, and was born in human likeness. And being found in human form he humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him, and bestowed on him the name which is above every name. Come, let us bow down, and bend the knee, and kneel before the Lord our Maker, for he is the Lord our God.
- *Presider* Surely he has borne our griefs:

People And carried our sorrows.

- *Presider* Let us pray. O God, you know us to be set in the midst of so many and great dangers, that by reason of the frailty of our nature we cannot always stand upright: Grant us such strength and protection as may support us in all dangers, and carry us through all temptations; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**
- People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

FOURTH STATION: Jesus meets his sorrowful mother

Presider We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

- *People* **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**
- *Reader 1* To what can I liken you, to what can I compare you, O daughter of Jerusalem? What likeness can I use to comfort you, O virgin daughter of Zion? For vast as the sea is your ruin. Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted. The Lord will be your everlasting light, and your days of mourning shall be ended.

Presider A sword will pierce your own soul also:

People And fill your heart with bitter pain.

- *Presider* Let us pray. O God, who willed that in the passion of your Son a sword of grief should pierce the soul of the Blessed Virgin Mary his mother: Mercifully grant that your Church, having shared with her in his passion, may be made worthy to share in the joys of his resurrection; who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**
- People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

FIFTH STATION: Simon helps carry the cross

Presider We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**

Reader 2 As they led Jesus away, they came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name, who was coming in from the country, and laid on him the cross to carry it behind Jesus. "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Presider Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me:

People Cannot be my disciple.

Presider Let us pray. Heavenly Father, whose blessed Son came not to be served but to serve: Bless all who, following in his steps, give themselves to the service of others; that with wisdom, patience, and courage, they may minister in his Name to the suffering, the friendless, and the needy; for the love of him who laid down his life for us, your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

SIXTH STATION: Veronica offers her veil to Jesus

Presider We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**

Reader 3 We have seen him without beauty or majesty, with no looks to attract our eyes. He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces, he was despised, and we esteemed him not. His appearance was so marred, beyond human semblance, and his form beyond that of the children of men. But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that made us whole, and with his stripes we are healed.

Presider Restore us, O Lord God of hosts:

People Show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.

Presider Let us pray. O God, who before the passion of your only-begotten Son revealed his glory upon the holy mountain: Grant to us that we, beholding by faith the light of his countenance, may be strengthened to bear our cross, and be changed into his likeness from glory to glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us

SEVENTH STATION: Jesus falls the second time

Presider We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**

Reader 1 Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth. For the transgression of my people was he stricken.

Presider But as for me, I am a worm and no man:

People Scorned by all and despised by the people.

Presider Let us pray. Almighty and everliving God, in your tender love for the human race you sent your Son our Savior Jesus Christ to take upon him our nature, and to suffer death upon the cross, giving us the example of his great humility: Mercifully grant that we may walk in the way of his suffering, and also share in his resurrection; who lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**

People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

EIGHTH STATION: Jesus speaks to the women of Jerusalem

Presider We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**

Reader 2 There followed after Jesus a great multitude of the people, and among them were women who bewailed and lamented him. But Jesus turning to them said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children."

Presider Those who sowed with tears:

People Will reap with songs of joy.

Presider Let us pray. Teach your Church, O Lord, to mourn the sins of which it is guilty, and to repent and forsake them; that, by your pardoning grace, the results of our iniquities may not be visited upon our children and our children's children; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

NINTH STATION: Jesus falls the third time

Presider We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

- *Reader 3* I am the man who has seen affliction under the rod of his wrath; he has driven and brought me into darkness without any light. He has besieged me and enveloped me with bitterness and tribulation; he has made me dwell in darkness like the dead of long ago. Though I call and cry for help, he shuts out my prayer. He has made my teeth grind on gravel, and made me cower in ashes. "Remember, O Lord, my affliction and bitterness, the wormwood and the gall!"
- *Presider* He was led like a lamb to the slaughter:

People And like a sheep that before its shearers is mute, so he opened not his mouth.

- *Presider* Let us pray. O God, by the passion of your blessed Son you made an instrument of shameful death to be for us the means of life: Grant us so to glory in the cross of Christ, that we may gladly suffer shame and loss for the sake of your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. **Amen.**
- People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

TENTH STATION: Jesus is stripped of his garments

- *Presider* We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:
- *People* **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**
- *Reader 1* When they came to a place called Golgotha (which means the place of a skull), they offered him wine to drink, mingled with gall; but when he tasted it, he would not drink it. And they divided his garments among them by casting lots. This was to fulfill the scripture which says, "They divided my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing."

Presider They gave me gall to eat:

People And when I was thirsty they gave me vinegar to drink.

Presider Let us pray. Lord God, whose blessed Son our Savior gave his body to be whipped and his face to be spit upon: Give us grace to accept joyfully the sufferings of the present time, confident of the glory that shall be revealed; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

ELEVENTH STATION: Jesus is nailed to the cross

Presider We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**

Reader 2 When they came to the place which is called The Skull, there they crucified him; and with him they crucified two criminals, one on the right, the other on the left, and Jesus between them. And the scripture was fulfilled which says, "He was numbered with the transgressors."

Presider They pierce my hands and my feet:

People They stare and gloat over me.

Presider Let us pray. Lord Jesus Christ, you stretched out your arms of love on the hard wood of the cross that everyone might come within the reach of your saving embrace: So clothe us in your Spirit that we, reaching forth our hands in love, may bring those who do not know you to the knowledge and love of you; for the honor of your Name. **Amen.**

People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

TWELFTH STATION: Jesus dies on the Cross

Presider We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

Reader 3 When Jesus saw his mother, and the disciple whom he loved standing near, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold your son!" Then he said to the disciple, "Behold your mother!" And when Jesus had received the vinegar, he said, "It is finished!" And then, crying with a loud voice, he said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." And he bowed his head, and handed over his spirit.

Presider Christ for us became obedient unto death:

- *People* **Even death on a cross.**
- *Presider* Let us pray. O God, who for our redemption gave your only-begotten Son to the death of the cross, and by his glorious resurrection delivered us from the power of our enemy: Grant us so to die daily to sin, that we may evermore live with him in the joy of his resurrection; who lives and reigns now and for ever. **Amen.**

People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

THIRTEENTH STATION: Jesus is taken from the cross

- *Presider* We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:
- *People* **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world**.
- *Reader 1* All you who pass by, behold and see if there is any sorrow like my sorrow. My eyes are spent with weeping; my soul is in tumult; my heart is poured out in grief because of the downfall of my people. "Do not call me Naomi (which means Pleasant), call me Mara (which means Bitter); for the Almighty has dealt very bitterly with me."
- *Presider* Her tears run down her cheeks:
- *People* And she has none to comfort her.

Presider Let us pray. Lord Jesus Christ, by your death you took away the sting of death: Grant to us your servants so to follow in faith where you have led the way, that we may at length fall asleep peacefully in you and wake up in your likeness; for your tender mercies 'sake. **Amen.**

People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

FOURTEENTH STATION: Jesus is laid in the sepulchre

Presider We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you:

People **Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.**

Reader 2 When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who also was a disciple of Jesus. He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate ordered it to be given to him. And Joseph took the body, and wrapped it in a clean linen shroud, and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn in the rock; and he rolled a great stone to the door of the tomb.

Presider You will not abandon me to the grave:

People Nor let your holy One see corruption.

Presider Let us pray. O God, your blessed Son was laid in a tomb in a garden, and rested on the Sabbath day: Grant that we who have been buried with him in the waters of baptism may find our perfect rest in his eternal and glorious kingdom; where he lives and reigns for ever and ever. **Amen.**

People Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy Immortal One, Have mercy upon us.

VENERATION OF THE CROSS

If you would like to say a devotion before the cross, you may come forward down the center aisle and offer a prayer in front of the cross. It is appropriate to touch the cross, if you wish.

CONCLUDING PRAYER BEFORE THE ALTAR *Please kneel or stand, as you are able.*

PresiderSavior of the world, by your cross and precious blood you have redeemed us:PeopleSave us, and help us, we humbly beseech you, O Lord.

Presider Let us pray.

We thank you, heavenly Father, that you have delivered us from the dominion of sin and death and brought us into the kingdom of your Son; and we pray that, as by his death he has recalled us to life, so by his love he may raise us to eternal joys; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

To Christ our Lord who loves us, and washed us in his own blood, and made us a kingdom of priests to serve his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. **Amen.**

The People depart in silence.

All are invited to gather at the labyrinth for a guided walk. Labyrinths are an ancient form of walking meditation; ours is open and available for anyone to use at any time.

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Holy Week at The Episcopal Church of St. Martin We Continue to Walk Together on the Journey to the Cross and the Empty Tomb

Good Friday, April 18, 12pm and 7pm*

At 12pm, we have Stations of the Cross in the church, followed by a guided labyrinth walk. At 7pm, we have the Good Friday Liturgy. Both Good Friday services include an optional veneration of the Cross and are relatively short services with no music or Communion.

Easter Vigil, Saturday, April 19, 8pm*

The Great Vigil of Easter starts outdoors with the lighting of the new fire, moves inside for dramatic readings and music, and finally ends with a festive Holy Eucharist. After the service, stay for a short reception in the narthex. We'll have chocolate and other treats, sparkling cider, and champagne. The Easter Vigil is a feast for the senses and the moment when the Lenten fast ends. Feel free to bring bells and noisemakers.

Easter Day, Sunday, April 20, 8am and 10am*

At 8am and 10am, we have a festive Holy Eucharist with music, preaching, and the choir at both services. Join in the fun after the 10am service, when we hold an Easter Egg hunt for children of all ages. Bring your baskets. We will also have a special Easter Coffee Hour—we invite you to bring sweet or savory finger food to share, if you wish. What a wonderful way to reconnect with your parish family and welcome all who are visiting our parish for the first time! The nursery will be open for both the 8am and 10am services for children ages 5 and under.
